Growth Vouchers

Up to £2,000 (100% funded)

- Linked to jobs safeguarded or new start businesses
- Eligible costs: specialist training or consultancy advice on business start up/recovery/growth, new products development, introduction of technology, carbon reduction...
- Application form endorsed by a UKCRF Adviser
- Project must be completed within 4 weeks or before 17 June (whichever is the earliest)
- Contract direct with supplier of your choice

Grants

Revenue or Capital Grant funding - up to £8,000 (80% intervention)

- Linked to new employment opportunities
- Eligible costs: digital adoption, carbon reduction, specialist consultancy/training, new product development, wage subsidy for Kickstart, student placement or graduate retention
- Plan produced and application endorsed by a UKCRF Adviser
- Application decision within 5 working days of receipt
- Grant must be claimed within 8 weeks or before 17 June 2022 (whichever is the earliest)
- Full defrayed expenditure evidence required!
