## Minutes of Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Village Hall on Tuesday, 11<sup>th</sup> May, 1999 at 7.30 p.m.

### 1. Minutes of the previous meeting

Upon a proposal by S. Bradshaw which was seconded by C. Burden, the meeting resolved that the minutes of the previous Parish Meeting, held on Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> May, 1998, having been read to the meeting, be accepted as a true and correct record. The minutes were duly signed by the Chairman.

### 2. Matters Arising from the Minutes & further discussion

The school governor is now Mrs. L. S. Baines and accordingly the problem getting information, as mentioned at the 1998 Annual Parish Meeting, had been resolved. Mrs. Baines had attended two of the three governors' meetings; the next is in September. A joint meeting was to be held on the 24<sup>th</sup> May re Sports Development.

The 30 m.p.h. limit is going ahead. Reference was made to problems at Howbeck Lane and Church Lane. The County Council would be asked to look at Howbeck Lane, and the problems on Church Lane associated with the school would be highlighted.

A police presence was needed at every parish council meeting. Members were not getting feedback on incidents which had been reported. Members of the public were encouraged to use "Crimestoppers", which could be done anonymously.

The Drop-in proposal involving the police, as mentioned in the 1998 minutes, would be referred to the Parish Council's Development Committee.

Creche costs would be placed on the next Parish Council agenda.

The Christmas Tree had been a success in 1998.

A flagpole had been acquired.

A Coffee Morning would be held on the 17<sup>th</sup> May in aid of the Kosovo appeal.

A summary of the results of the village appraisal was circulated.

The proposed Village Map was mentioned, as were the proposed new notice boards.

The hedge in front of the Council houses at Howbeck Lane needs reducing in height.

Mrs. Lilley would carry on with the Drop-in Centre, but not on a permanent basis. Sue Shaw had someone who could do both the Youth Parish Council and the Drop-in Centre, and the matter of advertising the position was discussed. It was agreed that this would be done by placing a notice in the shop, with a closing date two weeks from the date it was placed.

A millennium meeting would be held at 2.00 p.m. on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> June.

The Chairman closed the meeting at 9.00 p.m.
